Wheat Ceiling Price Increase In Effect

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP)—A four cent per bushel increase in the ceiling price of wheat went into effect today, the office of price administration announced.

The increase, which affects all levels of distribution, was necessary, the agency said, to fulfill the requirements of the stabilization extension act of 1944.

Flour ceilings, however, remained unchanged because of a flour production subsidy payment of 19 cents a bushel. The payment remains unchanged until December 31, and a new program will be announced later.
