MAN CHARGED WITH LARCENY PICKED UP

Howard Baker, who is wanted

Howard Baker, who is wanted on a larceny charge, was picked up in Klamath Falls by Sheriff Lioyd Low and Deputy Jack Franey on information from Sheriff M. R. Penrose of Yearington, Nevada.

Baker admitted that he is a probation violator on a forgery charge, and that during the months of April, May, and June of 1944, he cashed cheeks from Los Angeles, Calif., to Rano, Nev., including the towns of Napa, Vallejo, Santa Paula, Santa Maria, Salinas, and Richmond in California, according to Sheriff Low.

The caset number of cheeks cashed was not recalled by Baker, but amounts remembered by him totaled \$1678, the sheriff said.

H's Easy To Make Anytime With This Simple Recipe

- 6 Medium Sized Oranges (2 Ibs. Sliced)
- (2 lbs. Sliced)
 6 Caps Water
 74 Cup Lemon Julce
 (About 6 lemons)
 1 Package M.C.P. Pectin
 9/2 Level Cups Sugar
 (Measured ready for use)
- Cut oranges in cartwheels with very sharp knife to make slices thin as possible. Discard the large flat peel ends. Sliced fruit should weigh 2 pounds.

 6. Add augar (previously measured). Stir gently until it has reached a full rolling boil, and BOIL EXACTLY 4 MINUTES. Remove from fire; skim and attr by turns for 5 minutes.

 7. Pour into lars. If you use plat and all the previous state of the pre
 - 7. Pour into jars. If you use pint or quart jars, seal hot and invert jars on lids until Marmalade begins to set. Then, shake well and set jars upright. This keeps the peel evenly distributed throughout.

NOTE: This recipe works equally well with Navel Oranges or Valen-cias. When either earlety is overripe and peel is soft, use 34-cup Lemon Juice instead of 14-cup. (Be sure to discard any seeds.) This recipe makes 7 pounds of prize-winning Orange Marmalade.

The war price and rationing board announced Thursday that as of December 16, all B-4s and C-4s, gasoline coupons, will be void as far as service station operators are concerned. On December 16, coupon holders will start using B-6s and C-6s.

Truck owners were advised

that they must immediately mail to the board certificates of war necessity in order that first quarter gasoline may be issued. If these certificates are not in by December 20, the board does not guarantee they will be issued by January 1, 1945.
