

U. S. MAINTAINS FIRM STAND ON INTERVENTION

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States that Britain does not seek special areas of political privilege.

No Promises

While Russia has not given such flat promises, it was said, Premier Stalin has given no signs of disagreement with the American position.

LONDON, Dec. 14 (AP)—Prime Minister Churchill, under continuing attack over Britain's policy in Greece and Italy, served notice today he was standing firm and might hit back in another address to the nation.

He opened an inconclusive commons debate with a terse report that British casualties in Greece "since our landing this year" were about 460. Churchill did not make clear whether these included all casualties in the current fighting in Athens.

Under laborite cross-questioning about what he had told Count Carlo Sforza concerning King Vittorio Emanuele, Churchill said he had approved a continuation of the Italian king's "regime until the military situation had got into a better condition."

Production Indicated

Mel Barraon, supervisor of the Modoc forest, indicated that reduction in the timber cut in that area will likewise occur after the war.

Tebbe gave a report on conditions throughout the northwest showing a similar depletion of available saw timber. He said that the most favorable situation is at Roseburg, and that Eugene also is in the center of

Tebbe commented that in the west, with lots of virgin timber, people have scorned "little business" such as has been undertaken successfully in the lumber towns of the east.

Mass Production

"We have concentrated on mass production of boards," he said. "We have sent them elsewhere, where secondary industries used them for raw material and secured for themselves the additional profit and added man-days of labor. The time has come when we must secure these things for ourselves. In Klamath Falls as throughout the northwest what we need is more plants using lumber rather than logs as raw material."

Progress Eyed

He discussed progress that is now being made, in the pine country as elsewhere, in remanufacture and refinement processes.

Mays, in his talk, made the following suggestions:

- Increase the utilization in areas now being logged.
- Search for new uses and markets for lodgepole pine, white fir and incense cedar.
- Develop remanufacturing.
- Intensify and expand agriculture in the Klamath basin.
- Don't bring pressure on public agencies to overcut the public timber just to continue some mills for a few more years.

Discussion of general forest policies was given by John C. Kuhns, assistant regional forester from the Portland office, who accompanied the other officials to Klamath Falls.

Malcolm Epley, president of the chamber of commerce, asked Kuhns and Tebbe of the regional office to consider a suggestion that a regional or sub-regional office be established in Klamath Falls.

The forestry men remained here today for conferences with the county court and others.

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FIRST ARMY HITS ROER HEADWATERS

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Saar basin. Nine miles southeast of Saarbrücken, the shell-torn Saar capital, 35th division troops clung to their foothold inside the Reich at Habkirchen.

Breaks Line

In the south the U. S. seventh army of Lt. Gen. Alexander M. Patch plunged through another section of the Maginot line northwest of Bitché and 31 miles from the Saarland's southeast corner. These troops were 12 miles below Zweibrücken, Palatinat city which has been raked by seventh army shells.

Hodges' troops southeast of Monschau, springboard of the new attack, were shelling into position for a sweep behind enemy Roer river defenses. The northern wing of this assault plunged toward the river's west bank. Light, medium and fighter bombers lashed fortified positions ahead of the ground troops.

NEW YORK, Dec. 14 (AP)—A spokesman for the Greek EAM, Losta Gavrilidis, in a speech over the "Free Greece" radio transmitter in Athens, today accused Premier George Papandreou of breaking an agreement made last May 20 in Lebanon which he said stipulated that "vile war criminals and collaborators with the occupier should be arrested and punished."

The federal communications commission reported the broadcast.

"Two months after the liberation, not only had none been condemned, not only had those guilty of the destruction of the state not been arrested, but black marketeers and collaborators were continuing to circulate freely," Gavrilidis declared.

He said that although "the dissolution of all volunteer units and the creation of a national army were discussed in Leb-

anon," Papandreou "sought to dissolve" only "the popular army of the Elmas" and still "keep under arms" the Greek mountain brigade and other armed groups.
