

# Cutters Smash Nazi Attempt to Fortify Bases in Greenland

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14 (AP)—The cutters and aiding in reconnaissance during the series of engagements. An explosion had ripped out her hull and she had been on fire. It was evident, the navy said, that the Nazi crew had lived on the ice packs for some time after abandoning ship.

Simultaneously with the navy announcement, the coast guard at Boston disclosed the arrival there of the Externsteine, saying it had been taken before the crew had a chance to set off demolition charges placed in the engine room.

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## Oregon Needs Better Salesmanship, Says Oregonian Publisher

PORTLAND, Dec. 14 (AP)—Oregon ought to do a better job of salesmanship, says Palmer Hoyt, Oregonian publisher and former domestic director of the office of war information.

Urging larger advertising appropriations by the state legislature, Hoyt proposed a million-dollar campaign to drum up more tourists and more industry in peacetime.

"We've never had an inferiority complex, but we rather liked things as they were," he told a businessmen's club. "It's up to us now to get the right kind of people interested in our empire."

## ARMY CASUALTIES NEAR 500,000 MARK

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14 (AP)—Army casualties for all theaters now total 483,957.

Secretary of War Stimson announced this figure today, and said it represents casualties reported through November 28. This was an increase of 9059 for a one week period between November 22 and 28.

Casualties for all branches of the armed forces—army, navy, coast guard and marines—now stand at 592,368. The latest navy report announces 78,411 casual-

ties, an increase of 1291 from the previous week.

The army totals, together with those of a week ago, follow: killed 92,135 and 91,625; wounded 272,351 and 269,009; missing 62,788 and 58,926; prisoners 56,685 and 56,248.

The navy casualties: killed 30,029 and 29,738; wounded 34,503 and 33,469; missing 9483 and 9427; prisoners 4486, unchanged.

Casualties among American army ground forces in Italy increased 16,255 between September 25 and December 9.

Stimson said that from the time of the landing at Salerno in September, 1943 through last December 8 a total of 99,369 casualties had been reported. Of the total, 18,898 were killed, 67,194 wounded and 12,274 are missing. As of September 25, the list had reported 15,889
