

TO COMBAT FEVER

PORTLAND. Dec. 18 (P)— Dr. Thomas L. Meador, city health officer, today recom-mended a seven-point program to combat undulant fever in Portland.

At Christmas parties, flimsy dresses and paper caps around the fireplace filled with Christmas paper and wrappings should be avoided. To further prevent possible casualties, he advises that Christmas trees be removed and destroyed immediately after Christmas Day.

Officers of the National Safety Council and other safety agencies are urging Oregon drivers and pedestrians to drive and walk more carefully this year to prevent the customary trend toward traffic accidents in the holiday season Included in the program are a code governing the manufac-ture of ice cream and other frozen desserts, proper pasteur-ization or aging of cheese and 100 per cent pasteurization of milk and butter.

milk and butter.

His recommendations came after a survey of 90 ice cream fountains disclosed high bacteria count in samples of some and in a number of containers used to wash ice cream dippers.

Dr. Meador said the survey showed that milk products, other than in bottles and cans, were not properly controlled.
