

U. S. FIGHTER PLANES FLYING FROM MINDORO

A sizeable force of Superfortresses, striking in waves, bombed the Hatusodki aircraft factory for two and a half hours early this afternoon. It was the second raid this week on a Mitsubishi aircraft plant at Nagoya. The raid may have been designed to

finish off the Hatusodki works, badly damaged 10 days ago. Tokyo said about 100 Superfortresses were in the attacking waves, with the usual claim that little damage was done. The war department made the first announcement of the raid scarcely 12 hours after reporting about 60 China-based B-29s effectively bombed an aircraft plant at Mukden, Manchuria. Two attacking planes were lost. At least 15 and possibly 22 interceptors were shot down. American bombers patrolling from the central Philippines to Borneo sank four enemy coastal freighters and damaged 10 other surface craft ranging from tugboats to a 6000-ton freighter-transport. Five Japanese planes were wiped out. Two islands, 750 miles south of Tokyo on the B-29 route from Saipan, was bombed for the 13th successive day as Japan showed increasing alarm over air strikes. The diet prepared to meet Sunday, ready to adjourn to air raid shelters at the first sound of air raid sirens. Japanese trains began changing the tones of their whistles to avoid confusion with frequently blown air raid sirens. Chirping said large numbers of laborers were conscripted to move more war industries from the home islands to Manchuria.

A life sentence would be adequate because if he were guilty, then he would have to live in a cell with himself and bear the pangs of shame and remorse. E. C. Salter, pastor of Ardenwald Community church, Portland, said Folkes was convicted on circumstantial evidence, and that "it robs a man of his God-given right to life for the state to take his life." Other persons who pleaded for the commutation are George W. Halstead, pastor of Waverly Heights Congregational church, Portland; John Snedden, Portland, business agent for the Marine Cooks and Waiters union; and George R. Cromley, pastor of the First Presbyterian church, Woodburn.

U. S. 3rd Army: Front quiet; Canadian 1st and British 2nd Armies: Line unchanged.
U. S. 9th Army: Roer river line unchanged.
U. S. 1st Army: Blunted German counteroffensive temporarily in some sectors, turned it aside in others; Germans penetrated 32 miles into Belgium at Werbomont; reached Wiltz in Luxembourg, 48 miles from Sedan; new fighting reported 20 miles south of city of Luxembourg; offensive being contained on north and south flanks.
U. S. 3rd Army: Front quiet; Berlin reported force wheeling north toward Luxembourg to aid first army.
U. S. 7th Army: Front comparatively quiet. Withdrew yesterday from Nieder-Schlettenbach, five miles northwest of Wissembourg.
French 1st Army: Germans reported two or three new divisions assaulted nazi lines northwest of Colmar and made progress.

The new thrust, apparently in France in the direction of the third army's Thionville sector, was repulsed after a tank battle, field reports said.

Another dispatch last night said this greatest single conflict of the western front in its sixth blazing day had reached the critical stage as tens of thousands of additional men were thrown in every few hours by each side. This report said the Germans kept the initiative Thursday and that only on the flanks in Luxembourg to the south and on the Malmedy-Stavelot line had the advance been contained.
