A verdict of "unavoidable" was returned by the coroner's jury following an inquest held Friday morning in connection with the accidental death of J. C. Fitzgerald. He died Tuesday of injurics sustained when struck by a car operated by En-sign G. B. Law. Ensign Law testified in his own behalf and his story was substantiated by Ensign Richard J. Petipas, passenger in the Law car at the time of the accident. The men were en route to the station for their regular flying hours. Both are due to go over-seas soon, it is understood. Odl Olson, city police offi-cer, told the jury that Ensign Law's car was in good condition at the time and that the ma-chine came to a full stop with-in 18 feet. Ashley and A. B. Collins, Dr. George H. Adler, Klamath county coroner, conducted the inquest.


