Marines Leave For Furloughs

Approximately 15 marines from the Barracks here have been leaving every day for the past 10 days on Christmas furlough over the Southern Pacific railway, according to Southern Pacific officials.

Of these, 10 were destined to points in this general area, such as San Francisco and Portland, while five were heading back to the eastern states. It was estimated a total of 150 marines have left in the past 10 days on Christmas furlough over the Southern Pacific route.

Greyhound bus authorities here reported about 20 marines leaving each day with an estimated total of 200 en route home for the holidays. The majority of them were destined to Portland, Oakland, Seattle and Los Angeles, while five out of every 20 were going back east. These figures add up to a total of 350 marines stationed at the Marine Barracks, who have left Klamath Falls in the past 10 days on Christmas furlough.
