

HUNTING GUN BATTLE FOUGHT NEAR BAKER

BAKER, Ore., Jan. 5 (AP)—A 17-year-old, escaped federal prisoner, shot and wounded a woman and her companion in a five-minute gun battle near Baker at 9:45 last night.

The youths fired on the state police car two miles east of Baker when Officers Leo Suydam and Sergeant Curtis Chambers pursued a stolen hunting car. The youths used pistols and are reported to have been when they overpowered the guard at Emmett Wednesday night.

The chase continued into Baker. A shot by Sergeant Suydam punctured a rear tire of the stolen car. As it crashed to a halt, the bullet striking the car and Berkeley. Epidemic Cause for Lifting of Ban

PORTLAND, Jan. 5 (AP)—The undulant fever epidemic was the reason today for an ordinance repealing Portland's ban on milk sterilization plants outside the city.

The city council approved the measure, which permits dairies to set up plants on their own farms after approval of the city health officer. Commissioner Fred Peterson drew up the ordinance when Portland reported more than 200 cases of undulant fever—believed spread by raw milk—in 1944.

The ordinance allows dairies 10 years in which to install plants, stating that they must comply for a pasteurization period before June 30.

Chamber Favors '45 Importation of Mexican Nationals

Klamath chamber of commerce has notified members of the Oregon congressional delegation that it favors appropriations for importation of Mexican nationals for farm labor for another year.

C. J. Main, president of the Tulelake Growers, and Henry Semon, president of the Klamath Potato Growers association, told chamber directors that the 1945 farm labor outlook is even more critical than in the past few years, and that Mexican help appears necessary to solution of the problem.

Patients for Navy Hospital at Corvallis To Arrive in March

PORTLAND, Jan. 5 (AP)—Patients for the U. S. naval hospital, Corvallis, formerly the Camp Adair army base, probably will arrive in March. Lt. Richard Stanton, USN, public relations officer here, said today.

Hospital staff members will report soon, he said. The secretary of the navy has specified a Corvallis postal address instead of Albany, for the hospital.

An expenditure for one billion dollars for street and highway construction in the U. S. would provide annual employment for almost 200,000 men on the site of the projects, plus 450,000 men engaged in manufacturing equipment and supplying road-building materials.

Proposals for postwar air routes include two new northern trans-oceanic routes to Europe and Asia. One would go from Seattle over the North Pacific to Canton, while a new North Atlantic route would link New York and Moscow.
