Many have the state auto tax, which is due the first of the year, confused with the federal tax, Hawkins stated. The federal tax does not expire until June 30, and it is not necessary to purchase a stamp until that time unless in the case of a car sale or transaction, he concluded.

SENTENCES SET FOR CIGARETTE LOOTERS

PARIS, Jan. 11 (AP)—Five U. S. army enlisted men accused of looting supply trains and selling cigarettes and other goods were sentenced to 40 to 45 years at hard labor by a court martial today.

The five, all of company C of the 716th railway operating battalion, were the second group to be tried in cases involving 182 enlisted men and two officers.

Sentenced to 40 years were Pvt. Fred C. Jones, 10, Phillips, W. Va.; Pvt. Edward N. Wagner, 22, of St. Paul; PFC, Thomas G. Harper, 26, of Centralia, Ill.; and Sgt. Leonard J. French, 33, of Houston, Tex.

Sgt. Merle A. Young, 36, of New York City, was sentenced to 45 years.

Defense counsel made a special plea for Jones on account of his youth.

Bike Owners Urged To Get Licenses

Bicycle owners are urged to obtain 1945-46 license plates this week. Employees in the police judge's office, city hall, will start selling bike licenses Saturday from 9 a. m. to 12 noon, and all day Wednesday.

Those applying for licenses are asked to bring all necessary information with them. The charge is 50 cents for the two-year period. Licenses will be

sold each Saturday from 9 a. m. to 12 noon and each Wednesday throughout the day. Applicants are asked to appear only on these days.

Bull Charged With Possessing Stolen Property by State

The state of Oregon has filed a complaint of felony against Walter Henry Bull, charged with being in possession of stolen property.

On January 3 of this year, Bull allegedly stole and concealed 15 cases of ale, belonging to John Stolt, and valued at \$50.

The defendant has waived a preliminary hearing, and his bail has been set at \$1500 cash.

SKI FANS TO OPEN SPORT AT BARRACKS

Come snow, Marine Barracks' ski fans will have the chance to see some plain and fancy skiing.

Major Clyde C. Roberts, Barracks executive officer, announced Thursday that through the courtesy of P. C. Carlson, 1290 Patterson, an excellent ski run has been located on the town side of camp. Carlson is owner of considerable property adjacent to the Barracks.

A ski shack is under construction and should be ready for use with the first good snow fall. At least 170 pairs of skis are available, some of them purchased through the Barracks, many donated from local citizens, residents of Detroit, Mich., and other points. Donations came in as the result of stories which appeared in outside papers in regard to the need for winter sports equipment by the marines.

Roberts reported the site now contemplated for use is a "pretty good natural run" and should provide excellent sport both for

the old hands at the game and those just getting the hang of skiing.

The dam at one end of the ice skating rink, located at the parade grounds which centers the post, was nearing completion Thursday, Roberts said. A little water was frozen at that point now and that plans called to flood the place gradually to insure best possible ice. More than 75 pairs of skates are available at the present time, almost all donated by interested townsfolk.
