

# Buzzing Depth Charge Sent Verboord Just In Time

S. 10TH A. R. FORCE QUARTERS NORTH (A. Jan. 9 (AP)—Members of a combat cargo team flying over the Himalayan range from India to China heard a buzzing noise from the cargo cabin. The plane, piloted by Lt. J. E. Zerbe, Valley View, had the plane at 10,000 feet when the noise was heard. Radio Operator Cpl. Gilbert Sies, Staunton, Ill., to investigate. MacGill graduated from Trinity College, University of Toronto, in 1908, and was sent to Japan by the Canadian government to write of social conditions in the orient.

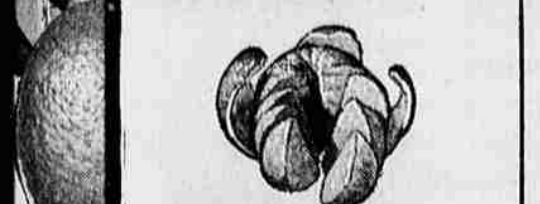
