LONDON, Jan. 15 (AP) — Ilya Ehrenburg, Moscow's best-known newspaperman, declared in Pravda today that Russia intends to deal with German war criminals in her own way.

"We ourselves will judge our torturers and this we will entrust to nobody," Ehrenburg said in the article which was broadcast by the Moscow radio.

"Russia is not a member of the allied war crimes commission in London."
