\$3,500,000 Paid to Oregon Farmers For Water, Soil Practices

CORVALLIS, Jan. 19 (A)—
Immediate results in increased food production were shown as a result of \$3,500,000 paid Oregon farmers last year for soil and water conservation practices, the state AAA committee chairman reported here.

The payments will give agriculture longtime benefits, R. B. Taylor, Adams, told 150 county committeemen at the opening session of the state AAA conference yesterday.
