Farmers Asked For Definite Gas Data

More definite information is requested from farmers submitting applications for farm transportation to the county farm transportation committee, according to Ted Dunwoodie, secretary of the agricultural adjustment agency in Klamath county.

Farmers applying for motor fuel should list their proposed activities for the next three months from the date of application and state why gasoline is needed.

Supplemental forms are obtainable at either the Klamath office of the OPA or at the AAA office in the federal building. Correct information in filling out these forms is imperative, in order that the application may be given proper consideration, he said.

The War At a Glance

Western front: Allied planes hammered incessantly at German transport fleeing Ardennes battle sector; British pushed toward juncture with Americans on Roer river; Ardennes salient virtually obliterated as Americans moved up toward German border; French continued offensive in south against Colmar pocket.

Russian front: Berlin said East Prussia was cut off as Russians reached the Baltic coast; soviet armor reported storming across Oder in Silesia; fall of Breslau seemed imminent; decisive battle said to be developing in Poznan area, 137 miles from Berlin.

Pacific front: Clark field near Manila under siege; Luzon capital 50 airline miles from American columns; network of defense caves captured near Clark field; Banban river crossed, town of Banban taken.
