

# RESUMED OUTPUT OF ALUMINUM SLATED

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7 (AP)—Resumption of aluminum manufacture to hold the national stockpile above the 250,000,000 pound mark was indicated yesterday by George C. Heikes, director of the aluminum division of the war production board, in a conference with Pacific northwest congressmen.

Present facilities are producing only 91,000,000 pounds per month as against a military demand of 170,000,000 pounds monthly, Rep. Anzell (R-Ore.) said Heikes told the group. This has brought the stockpile down to 450,000,000 pounds.

Increased production from the DPC plants at Troutdale, Ore., and Vancouver, Wash., is desired, Anzell said, although at the former, particularly, man-power limitations have handicapped this possibility. The defense plant corporation mill in Spokane has boosted production to 6,000,000 pounds a month.

Attending the conference were Senator Cordon (R-Ore.) and Representatives Stockman (R-C.), Ellsworth (R-Ore.), Jackson and Savage, (both D-Wash.) and Holmes and Horan (both R-Wash.).
