

Circulation of U. S. Papers Increases

NEW YORK, Feb. 10 (AP)—Circulation of the 1744 English language daily newspapers in the United States reached a new high of 45,954,838 during 1944. Editor and Publisher's 1945 yearbook reports. The publication, out this week, lists the gain over 1943 circulation as 3.4 per cent. Sunday papers also reached a new high, the yearbook says, with 37,945,622 circulation, a 653,790 gain. The number of morning newspapers increased by five to 388 while the number of evening papers decreased by 15 to 1496, the publication reports. Several evening papers changed to the morning field in 1944.

Probate of Estate Finally Completed

PORTLAND, Feb. 10 (P)—It took almost 47 years, but probate of the half-million dollar estate of John Green finally has ended. The pioneer Portland business man's will was filed April 11, 1897. It was only after recent sale of a downtown building that probate ended with final distribution to 35 heirs, including grandnephews and grandnieces throughout the country.

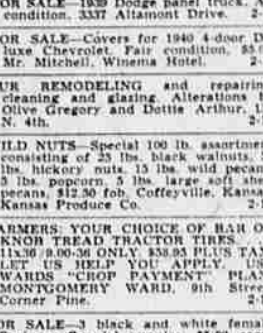

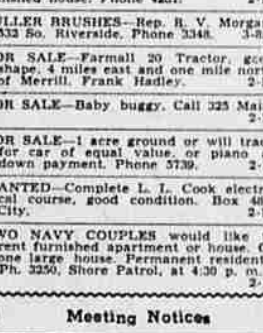

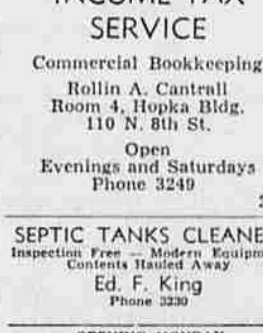
