Flood Conditions Caused at Head of Lost River

An inch and a quarter of rain fell at the Clear lake dam area yesterday, according to reclamation authorities. This rainfall created flood conditions at the head of Lost river and at noon yesterday over 1200 second feet were passing Malone dam at the head of Langell valley.

With the storm abating and the present cold weather in evidence last night, flood waters will spread out through Langell and Poe valleys and it is not anticipated that the capacity of the Lost river diversion channel will be exceeded. Should the capacity of the diversion canal be overtaxed, excess water would be spilled into Tule lake, reclamation officials said.
