## Twice as Many Federal Workers Get Deferment

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15 (AP)—The number of federal workers receiving draft deferments because of their employment has more than doubled since last year, congress was told today. The information came from Selective Service Director Lewis B. Hershey in a report which said 265,909 government jobholders qualified for military service were deferred as of December 1, 1944. State leaders included California 25,949, and Texas 17,404. Other state figures included: Idaho, 2263; Montana, 1769; Nevada, 538; Oregon, 1903; Utah, 3564; Washington, 9379. Alaska had 454.

**Housewives, Business Men Asked to Garden**

CORVALLIS, Feb. 15 (AP)—Housewives and businessmen were called to the spade and hoe again as Oregon State college officials began mapping the state's third victory garden drive. The extension service, skipping a state convention, will hold county victory garden committee meetings to urge home gardeners to equal last year's production of 40 per cent of the nation's fresh vegetables. Extension officials reported 55,000 farm gardens in the state last year—the same as in 1943; and 120,000 gardens in cities and towns of Oregon—about 25,000 less than in 1943.
