

WANKING OF PRISON RUMORED

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16 (AP)—A Japanese prisoner of war who was approximately 30 years old and was captured by the Japanese in the Philippines during the war, has been given to the war department, disclosing a rumor that the prisoner was a Japanese spy.

The war department, which has received no confirmation of the rumor, has asked the names of the prisoners who might have been aboard the vessel.

A response has been received up to this time, a department spokesman said.

PORTLAND, Feb. 16 (AP)—An aged Chinese native and his wife, who said they had waited 58 years to become American citizens, will have to wait two more years for a final decree.

Hing Quong Chin, 75, and Quan Gue, his wife, took their plea to naturalization court yesterday. Their eyes clouded with tears when informed of the required waiting period.

The Oriental exclusion act—now relaxed—already had denied them citizenship for over half a century.

Bill to Keep Loaded Arms Off Roads Eyed

OLYMPIA, Feb. 16 (AP)—A bill to prohibit the carrying or possession of a loaded rifle or shotgun in vehicles on public roads was introduced in the legislature today by Sen. H. N. Jackson (D-Pierce).

Sen. Jackson, who is fisheries committee chairman, also presented a bill to abolish the fisheries fund. Fines, catch taxes, license fees and such revenues would be credited the general fund under the proposed legislation, which stipulates further that appropriations for the department would be made from the general fund.

Livestock Groups Meet Second Day

CORVALLIS, Feb. 16 (AP)—The ninth annual meeting of the Western Oregon Livestock association—cut to less than 50 as required by ODT—went into its second session on the Oregon State college campus today.

Committees reported on predatory animal control, range improvement problems, transportation and marketing, and resolutions. The small gathering will settle urgent business and keep the organization active, said President R. C. Burkhart, Lebanon.

BLOOD they will get results that will be worth while in damage to the enemy.

What we're getting today is practically a ringside account from a navy observer in a B-29 high above the smoke of the roaring battle below. His account is based on what he sees plus the pilot conversations he listens in on.

He radios his story to our bases, which relay it on to us. The fleet is still keeping radio silence. There will be much more to tell as the hours and the days pass.

ON the western European front, the Canadians now hold 20 miles of the south bank of the Rhine (the Rhine turns to the west just above where the Canadian army is attacking.)

With the flood created by the blowing of the dams at the head of the Roer receding, the Germans are concentrating artillery and buzz-bomb fire on our U. S. 1st and 9th armies, which are waiting to move eastward across the Roer valley into the Cologne plain some 20 miles west of the city of Cologne. The nazis evidently expect this to be an attack in force.

Our 1st army patrols are reported this morning to be already across the upper Roer valley.

ON the eastern European front, Konev's right flank MAKES CONTACT with Zhukov's left flank. The main body of his army is OUTFLANKING the German line that has been holding Zhukov up.

Thus, Berlin is facing Russian attack from TWO directions. While it is standing off one Russian assault from the east it is being encircled by another force to the south.

Berlin announces that practically all of Germany has been placed under martial law, with military trial (and presumably execution) for "whoever tries to evade his duty toward the community."

BERLIN radio says today that several million refugees are swarming ahead of the Russians into central Germany, messing the military situation up. These

refugees are mostly women and children, as ALL the men have been taken into the Volksturm (home guard.)

It looks bad for the nazis. But keep your fingers crossed. We learned back in December that it is unsafe to jump to conclusions. Take the news as it comes, from day to day, and let it go at that.

State Venereal Disease Clinic Opens

PORTLAND, Feb. 16 (AP)—The state's new venereal disease clinic opened today for penicillin therapy of syphilis and gonorrhea.

Treatment will be confined to women at first, but the United States public health officer in charge said men and children suffering congenital syphilis will be accepted later.

The center houses 60 patients. Only volunteer patients will be treated.

Silent Screen Star Hurt In Accident

HOLLYWOOD, Feb. 16 (AP)—Marjorie Rambeau, silent screen star, suffered a skull fracture, broken leg and bruises in an automobile accident early today.

Her physician, Dr. Walter Sullivan, said her condition was satisfactory, although it was too early to determine whether she sustained internal injuries.

The actress' sister, Thelma Rambeau, suffered a broken leg and bruises when their automobile struck a parked car, skidding 50 feet and hit a tree.
