Lost River Channel Now At Full Capacity

The Lost river diversion channel is now operating at full capacity, according to Klamath reclamation authorities, as a result of the recent heavy rainfall in the upper reaches of the Lost river watershed.

Flood conditions will reach their peak some time today, but no water will be spilled into Tule lake. Lost river has dropped about six inches at Harpold dam and a further drop is anticipated by reclamation officials.

This is the first time in two years that water conditions have taxed the capacity of the diversion channel.

Couple Found Dead From Gas Poisoning

SEATTLE, Feb. 17 (AP)—Mr. and Mrs. William A. McGregor were found dead in the basement of their home last night, victims of what Deputy Coroner George Hall described as accidental gas poisoning.
