 Workman, first to be arrested on a secret indictment, is alleged to have written an obscene letter on January 29. Witnesses testifying before the jury were O. R. Moeller, Workman's employer, and Henrietta Pearl Kahn.

The charge of sodomy, placed against Edward William Goedert of Merrill at the time of his arrest on January 31, was upheld by the grand jury. Witnesses called in this case included Robert Stone, Pearl Stone and H. J. Hendrickson, county juvenile officer. Goedert is said to have committed the act of sodomy, involving a 7-year-old boy, at his cabin in Merrill.

New Mexico
 Samuel F. Ashwell, charged with larceny by bailee, is being held in Lordsburg, N. M., and sheriff's officers will bring the man back to Klamath county when extradition papers are signed by the governor of that state. Governor Earl Snell of Oregon has signed extradition papers which have been forwarded. Ashwell is said to have stolen a DeSoto sedan valued at \$73, from Balsiger Motor company, on January 5. Witnesses testifying were Vern Moore and Deputy Sheriff Dale Mattoon.

The indictment presented January 31 against Herbert Daniel Stevens, Marine Barracks, was re-submitted to the grand jury and the indictment returned Monday charged the marine with robbery, not being armed with a dangerous weapon, in connection with the death of Karl Bold, Henley farmer.

J. C. O'Neill, Stevens' attorney, filed a demurrer sustained by the court, at which time Judge Vandenberg ordered the case re-submitted to the grand jury. O'Neill charged that the original indictment charging Stevens with assault while armed with a dangerous weapon, did not show sufficient cause. He cited one instance where, in the indictment, Stevens was said to have stolen a "Chevrolet" and that the marine did not rob "from the person" of Bold.

THE Germans today are reported to be counterattacking heavily clear down in Slovakia and northern Hungary, where General Malinovsky is pushing toward Bratislava and Vienna. There is hard fighting clear up along the Baltic.

Lakeview Voters to Decide On Tax For Paving City Streets

LAKEVIEW, (Special)—The voters of Lakeview will go to the polls Monday, March 5, to either give the town council the power to levy an additional 24 mill tax for the next three years for the improvement of city streets, or to turn the proposal down.

If the ordinance carries, Lakeview will have approximately 40 more blocks of paved streets within the city limits, according to Walt Sandquist, city engineer. The 24-mill tax levy will for the three-year period raise about \$105,000 and it will cost in the neighborhood of \$35,000 a mile to do a complete job on the proposed construction.

According to the town council's plan, the new streets will be graded so that surface water can run off, permanent plant mix asphalt paving from curb to curb, gutters and a storm drainage system will be installed.
