## AFL MEMBERS TO CONSTRUCT WASTE DEPOT

Eight members of the AFL carpenter's union in Klamath Falls volunteered to assist in the construction of a permanent main salvage depot at 532 Market at a meeting of the union last night.

It was pointed out by Paul Lee, chairman of the county salvage committee, that a total of 20 carpenters are needed to build the depot and other carpenters desiring to aid in the construction of this building should contact C. D. Long at his office in the Labor temple.

This depot is being built in conjunction with the forthcoming county-wide salvage drive on waste fats, paper and tin cans to take place in March.

Salvage drives will be continuous from then on until the urgent need for materials is lessened, and it is hoped by the county salvage committee that residents of outlying communities will take advantage of this depot by turning in waste materials as they accumulate. This would put

the program on a more voluntary basis and alleviate the necessity of frequent salvage drives throughout the county.

The bulk of the material to be used in the construction of the building will be donated by Sessler Brothers and the Big Basin Lumber company. The location of the depot is also donated by Sessler Brothers.

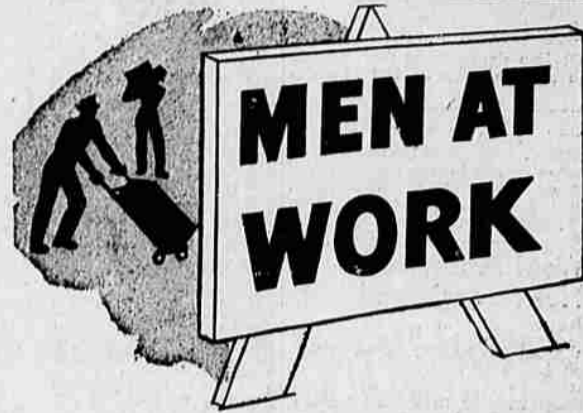
