

LANDING STRIP PROPOSED ON CEMETERY LAND

The city council Monday night was reminded of Klamath Falls lack of any civilian airport facilities when Louis Soukup asked the council's ideas on the establishment of a temporary landing strip on the lower portion of the Klamath Memorial park along the Klamath river.

Soukup stated that a strip 1000 feet in length and 75 feet in width would be sufficient, and said that little improvement other than leveling the land would be necessary. He pointed out that the nearest civilian landing field was at Worden and that fliers sometimes had to pay as much as \$13 for the trip into the city.

Councilman Rollin Cantrall said that local aviation interests should get together on a sit for a landing field, telling the council that other locations had been proposed.

He moved that the matter should be referred to the airport and cemetery committees, stressing that the cemetery committee should pay special attention to the proposal.

TWO COUNTIES FAIL TO RAISE QUOTAS

SALEM, Feb. 27 (P)—Only two of the 36 Oregon counties failed to raise their quotas in the recent Oregon war chest drive, Executive Director Irl S. McSherry said yesterday at the annual meeting of the state war chest. He did not name the two counties.

The only new officer elected was State Rep. Lyle D. Thomas, Dallas, chosen secretary to succeed Mrs. Marguerite Staek, Tillamook, who declined reelection.

BOY TO UNDERGO HEART OPERATION

VANCOUVER, B. C., Feb. 27 (Canadian Press)—Five-year-old Colin Gray will leave tomorrow with his mother and grandmother, Mrs. A. Pollard, for Los Angeles where Dr. Robert Jones will examine the possibility of undertaking a difficult heart operation which other physicians have said is necessary if the boy is to live.

The child's heart is four times normal size, prohibiting proper blood circulation and rendering his legs and feet useless.

Vancouver medical experts, who said the operation was necessary before the boy's birthday June 28, said only Dr. Jones and a Dr. Robert Cross of Boston might successfully perform the operation.

The trip is being financed by a fund of more than \$3000 collected by a Vancouver, B. C., newspaper from its readers.

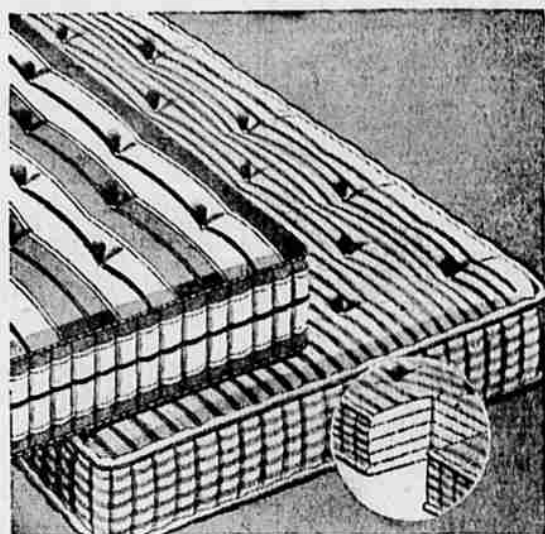

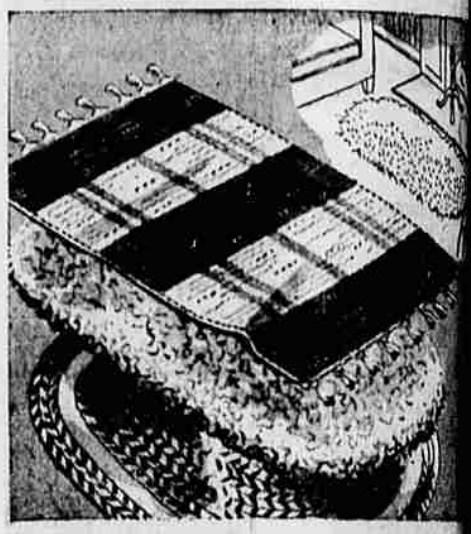

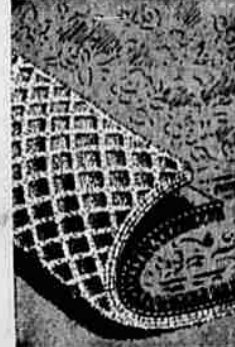
