The girl, resident of Edmonton, Alberta, Can., will be returned to her father, according to County Juvenile Officer Harold Hendrickson, who said today that the girl had left Edmonton to visit relatives in Salem and left there apparently to return home.

Instead she came to Klamath Falls. Hendrickson said the girl had put \$45 in her shoe when she crossed the Canadian border because she understood that she could come into this country with only \$10. She arrived here Friday.

NO COMMUNIST MADE OFFICER, SAYS M'CLOY

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27 (AP)—The army assured congress today that it has not and will not name as officers "any individuals who seek the overthrow of the United States government."

This statement came from Assistant Secretary of War John J. McCloy in testimony before a house military subcommittee investigating reports that communists are eligible for army commissions.

McCloy emphasized that "the basic consideration (is) . . . The individual's loyalty to the United States, a loyalty to be measured not in terms of allegiance to any one alien belief, such as communism, but in terms of all beliefs that might supercede his devotion to America."

"This policy has the broadest possible base," he said. "It is not limited to any one class of subversive or disloyal persons, but applies to all persons who advocate, or follow, travellers with those who advocate, the overthrow of our constitutional form of government."

"The army has not knowingly appointed as officers any individuals who seek overthrow of the government, or whose disloyalty has been otherwise established, and it does not propose to do so."
