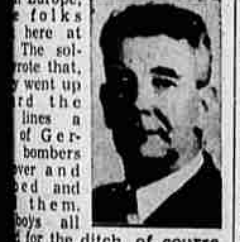

A Klamath Falls girl may qualify for one of the six \$200 scholarships offered by the Sears-Roebuck foundation in home economics.

Winnifred K. Gillen, home demonstration agent of the Oregon State college extension office here, states the qualifications for applicants of the 1945-1946 scholarship awards as follows: Applicants must be female, reared in Oregon; have a high scholastic record; have need of financial aid in furthering their education; have a desire to take a four year course in home economics; show promise of personality and ability and hold no other scholarship award.

Mrs. Gillen expresses a keen desire to see at least one girl from this area qualify for a scholarship. She states that any girl who has been out of school for a year or so may apply if she desires and is otherwise qualified.

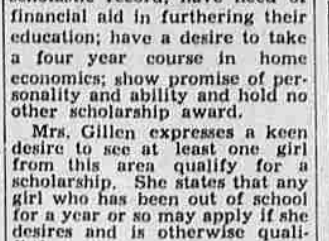
