

CHANGE EYED. LUMBERING FOR POSTWAR

PORTLAND, March 1 (AP)—Largest lumbering change in postwar era will be from harvesting virgin timber to harvesting timber crops as a source of raw material, Col. William B. Kelley, general manager of the Coast Lumbermen's association, said here.

Col. Greeley told the Oregon Lumbermen's club yesterday that the utilization of forest lands is essential if lumber is to lead the march in economic development of the Pacific north.

Col. Greeley stated that war demands in four years took 80 million feet of lumber, or 60 per cent of the entire nation's output, but that the total was less than that demanded in the period of active construction in the 1920s.

Stimson Denies Plans to Release Men After V-E Day

WASHINGTON, March 1 (AP)—Testimony by veterans administrator Frank T. Hines that the war department plans to release from 200,000 to 250,000 soldiers monthly after Germany's defeat was described as "without foundation" today by Secretary Stimson.

Stimson said in a statement that the basic elements in the war department's mobilization plan were made public last September 6 and have not been changed.

Hines, testifying before the house appropriations committee recently, said "the war department contemplates releasing from 200,000 to 250,000 men a month" after V-E day.

Said Stimson: "When hostilities cease in Europe, the war department intends to marshal against the Japanese every soldier and every item of equipment that can be used effectively to speed our final victory."

This means, Stimson added, that shipping priority will be given to the transfer of men and materials to the Pacific areas. Describing this as a "tremendous undertaking," Stimson said that it must be done "with all possible speed and vigor or we will pay a heavy price in the higher casualties of a longer Japanese war."

Stimson added that all speed consistent with the military situation will be observed in returning men who can be released from the army overseas. "But," he added, "any suggestion that large numbers will be coming home for discharge immediately after the fighting stops in Europe can only lead to cruel disappointment."

Hines had no comment on Stimson's statement.

How to add glamour to cabbage, onions, carrots and potatoes...

FRENCH STYLE CABBAGE
Combine cooked chopped cabbage, small amount of milk and a beaten egg. Brown in a solid cake in a little hot shortening or drippings in a frying pan.

COUNTRY STYLE SMOTHERED CABBAGE
Cook chopped cabbage in drippings with salt, pepper and small amount of milk until tender, stirring occasionally to prevent burning.

QUICK FRENCH ONION SOUP
Cook sliced onions in a small amount of shortening or drippings until limp but not brown. Add about 1 cup water and 1 or 2 chicken or beef bouillon cubes per serving; salt and pepper to taste. Serve with cheese toast or grated cheese sprinkled on top of each bowl of soup.

CARROTS LYONNAISE
Brown sliced cooked carrots, a little chopped onion, salt and pepper in hot butter or shortening. (Cooked the same as Lyonnaise Potatoes.)

TOASTED BAKED POTATOES
Rare potatoes, brush with melted drippings. Roll potatoes in mixture of crumbs, salt and pepper, then in beaten egg, then again in the crumb mixture. Bake in a covered casserole in a moderately hot oven (400° F.) for about 1 hour or until done.

BAKED MASHED SQUASH
Steam unpeeled pieces of winter squash until tender, scrape from shell, mash, season with salt, pepper and add enough milk to make the same consistency as mashed potatoes. Put into a baking dish, dot with butter or margarine, sprinkle with brown sugar and chopped nuts, if desired. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) until heated through and browned on top. This is a good way to use leftover squash or plan to cook enough at one time to serve the second time in this way.
