KEEP SALVAGE GOING TO WAR!

What Material Is Needed?

TIN

It will take years to get natural tin sources producing again, after they are all recaptured from the Japs. There are a thousand and one war needs for tin, and reclaimed tin from cans will be needed long after Victory.

How To Save--

Remove label, wash, remove top and bottom and place in can, smash flat, and box for handling.

Tin Can Drive--March 12 to 18

Klamath Falls people—get your cans ready. There will be a curb pickup Sunday, March 18. After that, as a box of cans is saved, take it to the central salvage depot at 532 Market street.

Klamath people outside Klamath Falls, take your tin cans to your local community salvage depot before March 17. There will be a pickup from rural depots on Saturday, March 17. If you don't know where your community depot is located, call your local salvage committee head. Continue to take tin cans to that depot as a box is saved.

PAPER

Munitions, rations, clothing and other supplies that are shipped to the tropics must be protected by water-proofed paper. This is just one small part of the drain on our paper supplies. Reclaiming paper is a vital and continuing need.

How To Save--

Lay papers and magazines flat and tie SECURELY in EASILY HANDLED bundles.

Waste Paper Drive-- March 19 to 25

Klamath Falls people, get your waste paper ready. There will be a curb pickup Sunday, March 23. After that, take your bundles to the central salvage depot at 532 Market St. as the bundles are completed.

Klamath people outside Klamath Falls, take your waste paper to your local community salvage depot before March 24. There will be a pickup from rural depots on Saturday, March 24. If you don't know where your community depot is located, call your local salvage committee head. Continue to take paper to that depot as it is saved.

FATS

Waste fats contribute essential ingredients for explosives, opiates and other drugs for the battle fields, lubricants, fabrics, soaps and synthetic rubber. It is not necessary to go farther. Fats are needed NOW more acutely than ever!

How To Save--

Strain into a tin can and keep in a cool place until can is filled.

Waste Fats Drive-- March 26 to 31

Sell all the fats you have accumulated to your own butcher or to Sessler Bros. before this period is over—receive 2 Red Points per pound, plus cash. Continue to sell fats as saved.

Following are the people who voluntarily are taking care of all the details of organization that are necessary to be sure that the salvaged materials get to reclaiming plants immediately after you turn them in. They are doing their part—it's up to you, individually, to SAVE the tin, paper and fat and then to TURN IT IN!

The Klamath County Salvage Committee is not interested in WHAT agency you turn your salvage to, but only that you DO turn it in to the channels that will take it to the battle fronts as vital war material.

You may phone the Boy Scouts, Junior Chamber of Commerce or Sessler Bros. for pickup service for tin, paper or fats at any time. You may leave any salvage at any salvage depot at any time. You may donate your salvage or sell it. Butcher shops buy fats. The Scouts, Junior Chamber of Commerce and Sessler's buy paper and fats.

All proceeds from donated salvage will go to the Scouts, Jaycees and the county salvage fund.
