Incidentally I understand the government is already fully prepared to take over the mines April 1 after the threatened strike goes on no more than 24 hours.

Stole Idea BUT his biggest trick is his plan to make the American people—mostly the poor who use coal and cannot get it under special rate contracts as railroads and industries do—pay his union 10 cents a ton tribute.

Lewis, of course, did not invent the sit-down strike either, but he imported it from France and perfected its use in this country, as a sabotaging means of extracting contracts from employers.

There is no basis in common public justice for a union collecting tribute from the people for any purpose. Formerly labor always based its plea for wage increases on an appeal against injustice.

Now Petrillo is collecting his two cents per record, not to lift the worker's wage, but to furnish free musical concerts (he says.)

The mine workers would not get a wage increase from the Lewis tribute as he intenas, he says, to use the fund for their medical assistance and insurance.

These men are becoming little Caesars exacting tribute from the people, including the poor who are great consumers of coal, if not phonograph records.

The recent Detroit and other strikes exhibit excesses in various lines which would take five columns to tell. Some say here the biggest strikes were solely designed to get the government to take over the plants, although no well-run union wants the government messing into its affairs.

In short, behind all the labor news recently has run the undercurrent of further justification for the prediction that the growth of power of unions is passing its climax and may decline abruptly in the coming years, solely because too few of its leaders know how to use its great new power wisely and intelligently in the real interest of both the worker and the public.

DIRECTOR OF RED CROSS TO SPEAK HERE

Hugo Vindal, an American Red Cross overseas club director, just returned from England, will relate some of his experiences Tuesday evening, March 13, at 8 in the high school auditorium.

There will be no admission charge. At the suggestion of L. Orth Sisemore, chapter chairman of Klamath county Red Cross, Vindal's visit is being sponsored by the American Association of University Women, League of Women Voters and the Business and Professional Women.

Vindal spent 14 months in England, Scotland and Wales, returning last year. He will answer any questions pertaining to overseas service of the Red Cross, and tell what the organization is doing for servicemen on sick leave, rest leave and recreation leave. How our men meet civilians of other countries; what they eat and where they sleep; how their personal problems are solved, are some of the subjects Vindal will touch upon.

Vindal's home is in Santa Monica, Calif., where he was assigned as field director of the army air force redistribution center on his return from overseas. At this post army fliers are rehabilitated through rest and recreation for return to duty.

Vindal is now representing the Pacific area office of the American Red Cross.

KINGS' PHYSICIAN DIES IN LONDON

LONDON, March 7 (AP)—Lord Dawson of Penn, physician to four British kings, died early today at the age of 80.

Lord Dawson, whose scientific skill had served London's east end poor as well as royalty, underwent an operation six months ago but his convalescence was reassuring. Less than two weeks ago he was consulted concerning the illness of David Lloyd George.

Physician in ordinary to King George VI, Lord Dawson also had held similar posts in the royal households of King Edward VII, King George V and King Edward VIII.

His brilliance had won him many high honors in the medical profession and honorary degrees from many universities, including the University of Pennsylvania. He was president of the Royal College of Physicians from 1931-38.
