

FDR RETURNS FROM VISIT AT HYDE PARK

WASHINGTON, March 8 (AP)—President Roosevelt returned today from a four-day visit to his home in Hyde Park, N. Y., and almost immediately went into conference with democratic congressional leaders.

Those calling at the White House were Vice President Truman, Speaker Rayburn, Senate Leader Barkley and House Leader McCormack.

The conference was understood to be devoted mainly to the legislative situation. A full day of engagements was announced by Jonathan Daniels, administrative assistant, with 12 rangers who took part in the capture of the Cabanatuan prison camp in the Philippines being presented to the chief executive after the congressional conference.

The rangers came with General Joseph Stilwell, chief of the army ground forces.

Engagements also were made for presentation of credentials by Baron Robert Silvercruys, new Belgian ambassador, and Senator Alberto Tachiani, the new Italian envoy.

The president also scheduled a meeting with Maj. Gen. Patrick A. Hurley, ambassador to China, and Lt. Gen. Albert C. Wedemeyer, American chief of staff to Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek.

Admiral William F. Halsey Jr. was invited to lunch with the chief executive.

Announcement that the president had returned from Hyde Park, where he arrived by special train last Sunday morning, marked a change of policy. Rarely since the war began has his return from visits of that sort been made public. When asked the reason for the change today, Daniels said:

"We felt that where security is not involved, security should not be invoked. As we go along through the war we come to a point where experience has shown that, without endangering the president, there can be some relaxation of rules that seemed essential before we had the experience."

Daniels added, however, that the policy of not announcing presidential trips in advance will be continued.

OPA PROVIDES MORE MEAT IN RESTAURANTS

WASHINGTON, March 8 (AP)—The OPA acted today to provide more meat for restaurants in some war-congested areas at the expense of a cut in the supply for housewives.

The agency announced that in deficiency areas to be designated under certain conditions, retailers serving restaurants may sell to these establishments up to 70 per cent of their current monthly dollar value of meat sales.

Heretofore, retailers' quotas to restaurants were limited in most cases to 20 per cent of their total dollar sales volume. OPA spokesman confirmed that this change could cut housewives' meat supply substantially in any deficiency areas set up. They said, however, that only a few probably will be designated, possibly only the Bremerton, Wash., area.

The plan was set up, it was understood, to meet a situation at Bremerton, where the navy reported war workers had

threatened to strike because of a scarcity of meat in restaurants. To qualify for designation by the national OPA as a deficiency area, communities must meet these conditions:

(1) Be an area where there are government owned or operated plants, (2) an area where, as a result of a population increase due to these projects, current meat quotas for restaurants do not meet their requirements. To be eligible for an increased quota, retail meat establishments may not be hotel supply stores or slaughterhouses, nor owned or controlled, OPA
