

# NEW EDUCATION PLAN REVEALED BY GRALAPP

Arnold Gralapp, city school superintendent, told members of the Klamath county Council of PTA last Monday of plans for the development of education in the Klamath basin on a 7-3-4 basis. This plan would group the first seven grades together, with an intermediate or junior group containing the 8th, 9th and 10th

grades. To the present 11th and 12th grades would be added 13th and 14th years, on a tutorial basis, carrying college credits, including courses of adult interest. Gralapp believed this segregation would facilitate further development of vocational, academic, cultural and practical education. Klamath basin residents could obtain advanced education near home, thus lowering its cost and enabling many more to receive its benefits. Gralapp also said passage of house bills 121-2 and 3 is of great concern to the future of education in Oregon and the County Council of PTA is recommending passage of these important bills. The meeting was conducted by Mrs. Ivan Crumpacker, vice president. Plans for the summer-roundup were discussed. Attention was called to "Symphonies

for Youth," broadcast by KFJI every Saturday morning from 10:30 to 11:30 a. m., the National Congress of PTA being one of the sponsors of this worthwhile program. The cookie schedule for local units of PTA was announced: Fremont, March 5 to 10; Fairhaven, March 12 to 17; Mills, March 19 to 31; Conger, April 2 to 7; Roosevelt, April 9 to 14; Riverside, April 16 to 21; Fairview, April 23 to 29; Henley, April 30 to May 5, and Shasta, May 5 to 12. Mrs. Henry Gerber presented the selections of the nominating committee for new officers: President, Mrs. Ivan Crumpacker;

vice president, Mrs. W. E. Guyer; secretary, Mrs. W. S. Metler; treasurer, Mrs. Ellis G. Mathews and all were unanimously elected.
