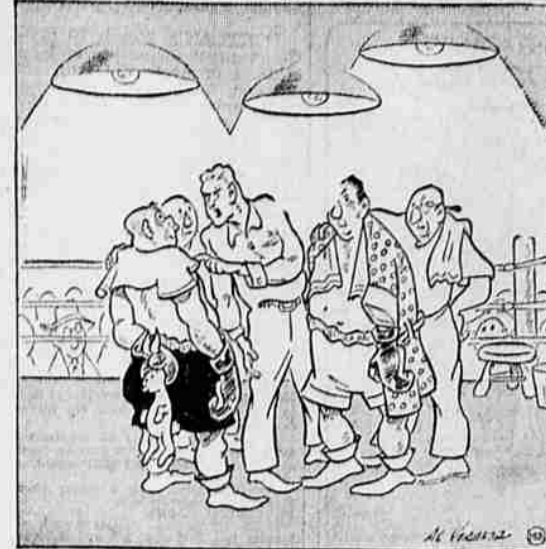
Military Service Requirements May Aid Baseball's Continuance Throughout '45
