

LENGTH OF TAX FACTIONS TO BE TESTED

CRAMENTO, March 13 (AP)—The first legislative test of the two-year rate reductions of a program to reduce the higher rates to finance postwar building projects scheduled to come today at Capitol.

The senate revenue and tax committee was to hold a hearing on bills backed by Gov. Warren to keep the present personal income and bank corporation franchise levies. Warren won the backing of the majority of the senate yesterday in a tax program and appeared at some democratic support.

Assemblyman C. Don Field of Salem, chairman of the republicans, said the caucus was "overwhelmingly" to keep as they are. Field said the caucus was "thorough" and was advocacy by some members of the \$100,000,000 industry building program.

Democrats also caucused on subject but Assemblyman W. Robertson, lower league house minority leader, said another caucus was called today.

Democrats did agree to support a measure which would raise the salaries of state employees earning less than \$4000 a year by \$25 per month.

Public Meeting Set Oppose Jap Return

RESHAM, Ore., March 13 (AP)—A public meeting to seek regional action rescinding order permitting Japanese return to their coastal homes at the end of the war will be held in Gresham Union high school tonight.

The properly Owners Property League, the sponsor, announced that speakers will include George Crandall, Seattle attorney, and State Representative Warren Erwin, Portland. Erwin is co-author of a legislative proposal to congress opposing return of the Japanese.

John Bergh, Damascus farmer and chairman of the league, also spoke. He has appealed a court ruling that the farm leased should be returned to Japanese-American owner.

Military Housing Project To Be Completed April 1

The 80-unit military housing project on Washburn way will be completed by April 1, according to schedule, stated Harry R. Gamble, project engineer, Monday morning.

Ground was broken for the construction of housing units for military personnel, November 24, 1944, but work has progressed a little behind schedule because of material delays. However, Gamble stated, material has arrived, and construction under K. T. Henderson, contractor from Longview, will be completed by deadline.

Floor sanding and linoleum laying will commence this week. Complete furnishings for the one, two and three bedroom homes is in storage in Klamath Falls, ready to be moved in.

Concrete sidewalks will be laid and streets made. As soon as weather permits, seeding will commence for lawns over the entire area.

Thirty of the units are being reserved for marine personnel and 50 for navy, according to the latest report. Details for filling the units are now being worked out.

The building contract has been extended to build 153 more units across the road as soon as the work on the present project is completed, Gamble said. Plans will be available for contractors by the end of the month and bids will be opened the first week in April.

Fifty units for civilian workers are to be awarded a contract next week, Gamble stated. They will be built at the foot of Main street on the north side of the canal. There is a two-room church grade school

nearby and Mills is just across the canal.

A bridge will be built across the canal to serve the shopping district and Mills school, said Gamble.

Howard Perrin is the architect in charge of the federal public housing authority, under which the project on Washburn way is being carried out.

ARRAIGNMENT SET IN 'TRUNK CASE'

SEATTLE, March 13 (AP)—Mrs. Cleo Patricia Wilkins, 24, will be arraigned March 20 at Juneau, Alaska, in the Sitka "trunk case" from which she was freed last week's trial here of Lynn James Gemmill on bribery charges, U. S. Attorney J. Charles Dennis said today.

Mrs. Wilkins is one of four persons indicted in the grand jury case, which involves the theft of a trunk containing money, jewelry and clothing from a house in Sitka. Mrs. Wilkins was a witness in the Gemmill case.

Gemmill, who was acquitted, is here awaiting reappointment as federal attorney in Juneau. His counsel, Will G. Beardlee, said Gemmill probably would not try the Sitka case because of inference of prejudice.

Survey of Rent Control Violations Slated For Coast

PORTLAND, March 13 (AP)—A door-to-door investigation of rent control violations in Pacific coast cities will include a survey of Portland conditions, District OPA Rent Director Daniel D. Gage said today.

E. B. McCutchan, Portland district rent counsel, is in San Francisco working out details. Cities to be surveyed include Seattle, Vallejo, Los Angeles, San Diego, San Francisco and Bremerton. Bureau of labor statistics show 22 per cent of Seattle investigations indicated overcharges.
