

**COMMITTEE OK EXPECTED FOR TAX REDUCTION**

SACRAMENTO, March 15 (AP)—Approval by the assembly revenue and taxation committee of Governor Warren's \$100,000,000 tax reduction bills is expected by administration sources today but confidence was not so great for speedy passage as measures once they reached the floor.

Democratic Floor Leader Al Robertson, Santa Barbara, declared there is a movement among the minority party members to force a postponement of the subject matter until after both the governor's \$100,000,000 biennial budget and compulsory health insurance have been disposed of. He plans to bring the matter before a party caucus within a day or two, he said, and he expressed the belief enough votes would be picked up from the republican side of the house to block action on taxation "until we know how much the budget is going to be and how much health insurance is going to cost the state, if we are to have a health insurance system."

"Personally, it seems idiotic to me, to set tax rates before we know how much revenue we are going to need to finance governmental operations," Robertson said.

Proponents of subsidies to counties for postwar reconstruction and public projects, immediate or postwar, were reported examining new proposals for alternative methods of obtaining state aid, in the face of checks sustained at the hands of the senate revenue and taxation committee. Among these are some for granting aid to counties for specific projects, such as power and water systems in congested areas, from current surpluses.

Mayor Roger D. Lapham of San Francisco threw his support to a radio address to the League of California Cities, proposing to amend taxes to the pre-1943 level, thus creating a surplus of \$10,000,000.
