Hard to Follow

THE public can hardly be expected to follow or understand the matter although it will have more effect upon the people's future (depressions, trade, the real value of wages) than the political peace imposed upon Germany and Japan...

Any serious objective analysis of the plan must show it to be a program to continue the existing world artificiality in financial values...

It is a working arrangement to collectivize internationally the various financial artifices devised by the nations in the past two decades...

It might do this five years, ten. It might do this well or badly. These are matters uppermost in the debate...

It proposes to raise nearly 18 billion (yes billion) dollars now, nearly nine billion to be loaned to nations or people at practically no interest for their own purposes...

We contribute more money and gold than anyone, and what we are supposed to get out of it is the acceptance of the dollar and gold as being the standard (best) money...

The dollar already occupies first position in my opinion but I think the real reason why our treasury wants to enter into such a likely losing proposition is that they feared the world would turn against gold...

Their enthusiasm for their scheme is based, I believe, on their belief that they have thus bought recognition of the dollar. But the critics see this purchase is apt to be costly at the expense of lost loans from the bank...

The British want this strenuously. They must have it to restore their world trade. We are in a position to make separate arrangements with each country, but their pound is in worse shape than our dollar...

That is why Lord Keynes, the British economist, et al are daily screaming in dispatches from London that the hope of the world rests in this matter. It does—for them...

Russia Indifferent

BUT you never hear from Russia—no criticism, no enthusiasm, no comment. I wonder why this is, in view of Russia's apparent chances to become a greater world trading power even than Britain...

Of course gold is nothing more than lumber to Stalin—something to sell, but it is the life-blood basis of capitalistic bookkeeping...

In our preoccupation with British and American interests, are we now permitting Russia to buy into capitalism at fire sale prices, the sale to run perpetually and for her exclusively?

I cannot even find out officially what it costs Russia to mine gold, their economics being completely isolationist and secret (also, their present gold holdings)...

But what of Russia and the effect upon her, and her anti-capitalism, a phase of the subject which seems to have been avoided in all comments I have seen on the plan?

DAVIS FAVORS CONTINUING OF PRICE CONTROL

WASHINGTON, March 15 (P)—William H. Davis, new economic stabilization director told government officials today that "now is no time to relax either the price controls or the wage controls" developed under the stabilization act...

Davis released the text of a letter he had sent to Dr. George W. Taylor, his successor as chairman of the national war labor board...

Instead of relaxing controls now, Davis said, this is the time "to push ahead" with all the seven points of the stabilization policy announced by the president in his message to congress April 27, 1942...

Davis said that Fred M. Vinson, who left the post of economic stabilizer to become federal loan administrator, "held the line" well, and that Taylor, Jones and Bowles deserved a full measure of the credit for the economic stabilization already achieved...

"Assured of your continuing support, I feel we can move forward with confidence," Davis wrote.
