Stimson Unaware of Abandonment Plans
WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—Secretary of War Stimson said today he knew of no plans to abandon the Alaskan highway in Canada.
He was asked at a news conference about the statement of Senator Magnuson (D-Wash.) in the senate yesterday that he understood the highway, built to form a military link between the United States and Alaska, would be abandoned.
"I know of no such plan," Stimson replied.
The secretary likewise said he had no information regarding another report by Senator Mead (D-N. Y.) that the date for closing the Canol oil development had been moved up from the previously announced June 30 to April 1.
