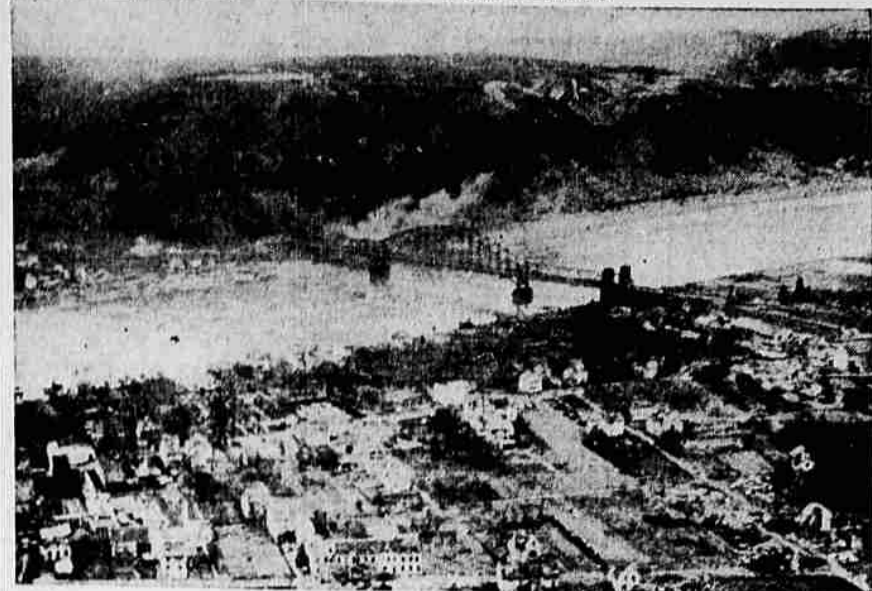

The commission also ruled that 12 ounces will again be the largest bottles of beer permitted for on-premise consumption in Oregon. An earlier order allow- ing 32-ounce bottles because smaller sizes were scarce, has been revoked.
