## 25 CANINES NOW IN CITY POUND

Twenty-five dogs are waiting at the city pound for licenses, new homes or the "long sleep." There has been an average of 25 dogs in the pound continuously this month, according to Poundmaster Amos Fields, since the deadline for buying licenses March 1.

Dogs picked up in the city without licenses, Fields said, are advertised over KFJL between 1:15 p. m. and 1:30 p. m. for three days. If at the end of that period they are not claimed they are either provided with new homes or put to sleep. All dogs received at the pound are examined for illness or disease and those with incurable sicknesses are automatically destroyed.

Owners claiming dogs who have been picked up in the streets must pay the board and keep of their pets during their stay at the pound, pay for the license, and a penalty of \$1 for being late with their application for a license.

Licenses cost \$1.50 for male dogs, \$2.50 for females and \$1.50 for spayed females.

Fields reminds dog owners that it is against the city ordinance for dogs to chase cars. Many injuries have been incurred by dogs and persons because of animals racing cars in the city.

The poundmaster also points out that after May 1 and through May and June, dogs found roaming city streets will be brought into court and the owners fined from \$5 to \$25.

Dogs may be boarded during the summer at the pound in oil heated kennels which are kept clean and sanitary. They are fed hot meals, given fresh water and medical care.

Pvt. Harmon B. Cress, 20, son of Mrs. Gladys C. Cress, 2949 Bisbee, was awarded the Air Medal for meritorious achievement in aerial flight while participating in sustained operational activities against the enemy.

Pvt. Cress is an aerial gunner in a veteran B-24 heavy bombardment group of the 15th air force in Italy and has flown on more than 15 bombing missions against the Germans in southern Europe. Before volunteering for aerial gunnery, Cress was a refueling unit operator in the same group. He has been in Italy for the past 13 months.

The gunner's brother, PFC Frank Cress, 23, paratrooper, was killed in action in Holland on September 28.

## HOUSING COUNT SHOWS DEFICIT

Results of housing questionnaires distributed among 685 married officers and men of the Marine Barracks showed a minimum net deficit of 500 family units remains.

The object of the questionnaire was to determine housing facilities in Klamath Falls for families of service men.

The complement of the Marine Barracks is now approximately 60 per cent of capacity and as it fills the housing situation will become progressively worse. By this token eventually the minimum housing need will be 658 units in addition to adequate quarters now being utilized in the city of Klamath Falls.

Forty of the necessary 658 additional units are now nearing completion and 115 more have been authorized to date.
