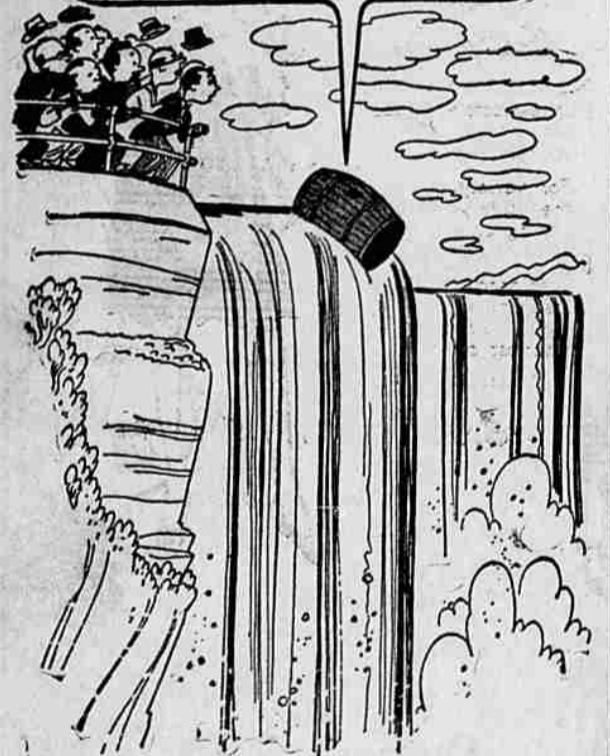
Reports were given by Bill Kunz, salvage chairman, on the tin drive of last Sunday and on the forthcoming paper drive slated for next Sunday.

## U. S. Subs Bag 15 More Jap Vessels

WASHINGTON, March 20 (AP)—United States submarines have added 15 more Japanese vessels, including five warships, to their bag of enemy shipping in the Pacific.

The navy said today the latest report from the American undersea fleet accounted for the sinking of three Japanese destroyers, two escort vessels and ten merchant ships, ranging from a large tanker to a small cargo ship.

The new report brings the total of enemy ships sunk by American submarines to 1072. Of these 117 are warships and 955 non-combatant vessels.

# WISE USE OF WASTE SALVAGE FAT URGED

Wise use of leftover kitchen fats is the first step in helping to increase collections of used household fats critically needed to make up a deficit in 1945 fats-oils supplies, according to Home Demonstration Agent Winifred K. Gillen.

Farm women and homemakers in small towns have been called on to contribute a large share of the 250 million pounds of used fats set as this year's goal, Mrs. Gillen says, and the county extension office is cooperating with local salvage committees in boosting Klamath county's collections.

Turning in all fat drippings and leftovers indiscriminately for salvage may not do as much for the nation's fat supplies as using the good-flavored leftover fats in home cooking and then

contributing to salvage any excess fat or fat that is strong in flavor, the U. S. department of agriculture points out.

The housewife who turns in four pounds of good bacon drippings, for example, and then buys a four-pound jar of fat for her home cooking does not increase the overall fat supply, and individually loses points and money on the exchange, Mrs. Gillen explains.

# Tokyo Reports Huge Fire Loss

LONDON, March 20 (AP)—The Tokyo radio said today that special "fire alleys"—often over 100 yards wide—which had been prepared in Tokyo and other Japanese cities had proved ineffective in halting the spread of

conflagrations started by the U. S. Superfortress raids.

The broadcast emphasized anew the vast damage done by the great Superfortress fire on Tokyo on March 10, when Japanese commentators said the heaviest raids on Germany.
