## No Plans Laid to Reunite Tule Japs With Families

TULELAKE—In answer to inquiries made by Japanese residents of the Tulelake center, the department of justice and the WRA joined today in stating that there are no plans for reuniting with their families, men who have been apprehended as dangerous alien enemies and removed from the Tulelake center to alien internment camps under the jurisdiction of the department of justice.

Any reports that such reunions are to be brought about are based on misinformation, it is announced by Charles Rothstein, special assistant to the attorney general in charge of the department of justice staff at

Newell. Rothstein conferred by telephone with the attorney general's office at Washington D. C., on the situation and with Raymond R. Best, project director, issued a flat denial that such families were to be brought together again.

Rothstein in part, stated that "the department of justice has no plans to bring about reunion at Tulelake or elsewhere. The men removed have been placed in internment camps under more strict control because they were engaged in subversive activities. The Geneva convention does not specify for such internees the right to have their families with them."

In a similar statement, Director Best added, "So far as the WRA is concerned, reunions are not possible in the Tulelake or any other center, even if interned men should be paroled. The regulations on the restrictions as announced February 15 remains unchanged and no person paroled from an alien enemy camp may be inducted as a resident of the Tulelake or any other center."
