UMATILLA county echoes of the senatorial reapportionment issue in the late legislative session...



Senator Merle Chessman of Astoria was one of the leaders of the fight for the bill...

Mr. Chessman writes to the Pendleton paper that he voted for the bill because he thought it was "manifestly unfair to have a single senator represent five counties..."

Senator Chessman added a paragraph to the effect that the voters of Ellis' district should apologize to the senate and the state...

Inasmuch as Senator Chessman is one of the state's most prominent public figures, with high prestige and reputation, this direct blow at Ellis carries unusual punch and significance.

Ellis' answer as carried in the Pendleton paper was that Mr. Chessman lobbied for the reapportionment bill, and refers to other legislators in support of that contention.

To those of us who know Senator Chessman, it is plain that his vote for the reapportionment measure was based on a conscientious belief in the justice of the measure.

"Dirty Shirt" SO much for the Chessman-Ellis argument. The East Oregonian in an accompanying editorial goes on to tell what a grand district is represented by Mr. Ellis, which no one has questioned.

That is silly balderdash and the East Oregonian knows it. The reapportionment measure would not have denied the counties of that district their representation in the senate.

Union, also, is in two districts. Because of the obvious over-representation in that section of the state, it was involved in an honest and fair-minded attempt to reapportion for the purpose of removing another inequity elsewhere.

The East Oregonian commits a public disservice by pretending that the reapportionment bill was based on prejudice or sectional antagonism. The result of such claims will be to create just that sort of thing in that section of the state.

Amendment THE senate having rejected the reapportionment measure, a constitutional amendment is now proposed to give the senate 31 members, instead of 30.

WFA Alarmed MOST experts here thought Byrnes was right. He did not write the order. It was prepared for him by the war food administration...

WFA was greatly alarmed, and incidentally if its policies had been followed all through this food situation, there now would be no shortages.

Now that Mr. Roosevelt has spoken thus, few people expect anything from the Byrnes "investigation." Nor can much be anticipated from both the house and senate investigations into food.

I cannot. The way I figure it, Mr. Roosevelt liked the feed-Europe policy for publicity purposes, and his own food authorities would rather appease the public in this country, and the conflict is mainly over what is the best publicity, rather than where to get more food.

The hog producers asked for an increased quota from the government, and got a decrease. The floor price is to be run down from \$13.50 to \$12.50 July 1 because the war food administration was over-ruled by Byrnes, who chose the Bowles OPA policy instead, thus limiting the price to the consumer, but discouraging production.

Cattle Problem THE ceiling price on cattle is to be run down from \$18 to \$17, discouraging beef production, by similar government direction.

He said that what Charlie wanted most was to be accepted as one of the gang again... as if nothing had happened. So we asked him over to pitch horseshoes with his good hand, and enjoy a friendly glass of beer and chew the fat like old times.

And you should have seen me pick up! From being scared of meeting people, Charlie got his confidence back and soon became his own self again.

From where I sit, Doc Walters gave us the right steer. The wounded men coming here don't want our sympathy or overenthusiastic help. They want to be treated like the rest of us... with a chance to rest and lead a normal life. And that's the least we can offer them.
