AWARDED DEU
First Lt. Edwin B. Lee of 4018 Boardman has been awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial combat against the enemy in the Mediterranean theater of operations. Throughout many combat missions against highly strategic and important installations, the young flier has demonstrated the highest order of professional skill, heroism, leadership and devotion to duty. The navigator of a 15th air force Flying Fortress, Lee formerly lived in Essex, Mont. He was graduated from Flathead county high school and attended Montana State college. Enlisting in the army on March 26, 1943, Lt. Lee received his wings the following March. Lee has flown 46 combat missions with the oldest heavy bombardment group in the Mediterranean theatre. He has been awarded the Air Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, and has earned the European-African-Middle East theatre ribbon with two battle participation stars. His father, Edwin S. Lee, resides on Boardman in Klamath Falls.

PARKER RECOVERS
THE 317TH STATION HOSPITAL, ENGLAND—Pvt. Emery Parker, 24, of Beatty, has recovered at this United States hospital from wounds received at Schmidt on January 12, 1945. While at this hospital, he received expert medical care, followed by a period of convalescence. He has now been released for a return to duty. Pvt. Parker is a member of an infantry unit. He entered the army on May 17, 1943. His wife, Esther, lives at Beatty. Sgt. Clifford V. Potrie of Shevlin, is a tank driver with the 4th tank battalion of the fifth army in Italy. His outfit fought on through Grosseto, Montecatini and Volterra and helped bridge the Arno river. The 4th's medium tanks were "sicked on" the Germans again just before the Gothic line at Futa pass.

How to Make Hot Cross Buns

HOT CROSS BUNS

6 to 6 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
1 cup milk
3/4 cup water
1 cake fresh yeast
1/2 cup sugar

1 tsp. salt
1 egg
1/4 cup softened butter or margarine
1 cup seedless raisins
1/2 cup currants

Sift and measure flour and sift again with spices. Heat milk until bubbles form around edge; add water and cool to lukewarm. Add crumbled yeast, sugar and salt, stirring until yeast is dissolved; add beaten egg, then flour mixture all at once. Add butter or margarine, raisins and currants and work until dough leaves side of bowl. Turn out on lightly floured board, knead gently until smooth, about 3 minutes. Place dough in greased bowl, cover with damp cloth. Let rise in warm place until double in bulk, about 2 hours. Remove from bowl onto lightly floured board. Shape into ball; place on floured board; divide into four portions; shape each into ball; cover with damp cloth; and let stand 15 minutes. Divide each ball into 8 small ones; place on greased baking sheet 2 inches apart; cover; and let rise until almost double in bulk. Brush with egg wash (1 egg yolk beaten with 3 tablespoons water); cut shallow crosses with scissors on top of each roll. Bake 5 minutes in moderately hot oven (425° F.); reduce to moderate oven (350° F.); and bake 15 to 20 minutes longer, or until done. When almost cold, mark crosses with thin icing made of powdered sugar and just enough cream to spread easily. Makes 32 buns.
