

Protracted Debate In Prospect Over Final Court Bill

SACRAMENTO, March 22 (P)—Advocates of state subsidies for cities and counties continued their battle in the assembly today seeking assurances of financial aid for local postwar construction as a part of any tax reduction measure.

Although Warren administration men expressed confidence in the Four bill, carrying out the governor's recommendation for extending for two years the 1943 tax cuts would eventually be passed, protracted controversy was in prospect over its final form.

Opponents of flat reduction without earmarking for the aid of cities paraded witnesses before the assembly to recite the plight of cities to cope with wartime population growths without parallel increases in local revenues.

Assemblyman Walter J. Fourt (R) Ventura predicted he could bring his measure to a rollcall before the end of the legislative session.

Increase of old age pensions from \$50 to \$60 a month, at 60, was approved by the Assembly Social Welfare committee after it heard Dr. Francis E. Townsend, veteran pension advocate.

The senate O. K'd and sent to the assembly a bill outlawing "dead or alive" rewards and one permitting veterans to borrow \$12,500 from the state for purchase of farm properties.

Part of the governor's fiscal program received approval of the senate governmental efficiency and economy committee when the group voted to add \$10,000,000 of the state surplus to the postwar employment reserve.

Dairymen Near Record Production

PORTLAND, March 23 (P)—Northwest dairymen are producing a near record amount of milk despite wartime labor and equipment problems and are not to blame for the current butter shortage, a war food administration official said today.

Paul C. Adams, dairy and poultry branch representative, expressed belief that the civilian consumption of butter must be limited as long as military demands require heavy production of powdered whole and condensed milk, cheddar cheese and ice cream.

The War At a Glance

The Western front: Germans reported mighty artillery barrage across lower Rhine and some reports said assault crossings had started; Americans widened Remagen bridgehead, captured Neuwied; Saar-Palatinate battle neared end as Mainz, Landau were cleared; massive air assault of reich continued.

The Russian front: Russians drove close to Czechoslovakia border in upper Silesia after spectacular breakthrough on 80-mile front, periling five major cities; red army in north battered close to Gdynia, Baltic port; Germans said assault on Stettin heightened.

The Italian front: Continued quiet.

The Pacific front: Americans seized Guimaras island opposite captured Iloilo, Panay capital; Americans on Luzon, 10 miles from Baguio, summer capital; Australians landed on Soraken peninsula on Bougainville in waterborne advance; U. S. planes blasted Cebu in Philippines; Japanese opened new China offensive for wheat crop northwest of Hankow.

SKIRMISHES OCCUR ON ITALIAN FRONT

ROME, March 23 (P)—Brisk patrol skirmishes occurred yesterday on both the Fifth and Eighth army fronts, with the enemy reacting to allied raiding parties with heavy machinegun and small arms fire, allied headquarters announced today.

In a short fight near San Aniano, at the entrance to the Bologna road net which has been heavily defended in recent months, one American patrol suffered light casualties. A short time later a 15-man enemy patrol tried to slip through the same area and was driven back.

In the fifth army area, American artillery concentrated on groups of enemy soldiers as well as movements behind the German lines.

An eighth army patrol operating northeast of Cotignola on the enemy's Senio river line caught a German work party digging in the opposite bank and inflicted a number of casualties. Farther south enemy patrols crossed the dike stream north of Faenza, but were driven off. During the past seven days American, French and British ships have been bombarding enemy targets on the Franco-Italian frontier and the Gulf of Genoa.

TWO NURSES HIT PROPOSED DRAFT

WASHINGTON, March 23 (P)—Two nurses suggested to congress today that if members of their profession were drafted for the army and navy other women should be drafted to help them.

"It is an anomaly to draft nurses and to leave the matter of their aids to the volunteer method," Miss Catherine R. Dempsey, president of the American association of Industrial Nurses, told the senate military committee.

The committee is considering a house-passed bill to make unmarried nurses aged 20 through 44 liable for a draft for the army and navy nurses corps.

A stand similar to Miss Dempsey's was taken by Miss Katharine J. Densford, president of the American Nurses association, who argued that a nurses draft would not relieve the immediate emergency which the army and navy say exists. It would take too long, she said, to establish machinery.

Chairman Thomas (D-Utah) asked Selective Service Director Lewis B. Hershey, who was present, how long it would take to set up the machinery.

EPIDEMIC BLAMED ON RAW MILK DAIRY

MOLALLA, Ore., March 23 (P)—State and county health officers today blamed a raw milk dairy, where one dairyman was found to be a germ carrier, for the diptheria epidemic which has stricken 44 Molalla residents. Dr. Harold M. Erickson, state health officer, said that besides the dairyman carrier, a woman

in the household is now ill with diptheria and a boy employ apparently had an undiagnosed case earlier. The dairy's milk was withdrawn from the market early this week.

"Contamination undoubtedly occurred at this source," said Erickson. "The explosive nature of the epidemic could not be explained on any other basis."
