

### MILITARY SERVICE POSITIONS OPEN

Living quarters are provided for war workers at the Umatilla Ordnance depot, at Ordinance, near the William M. Willard labor recruiter. Labor handlers and laborers are critically needed for present civil service positions at Ordinance now, Wilson. He will be available for interviews at the United States Employment office of Klamath through Wednesday, March 28.

Positions for laborers start at \$2682.66 per year; munitions handlers at \$2737.04 per year. Positions for workers are listed at very reasonable wages, with one, two and three room homes for married workers and dormitories for single workers. Houses may be furnished or unfurnished, are equipped with electric refrigerators and stoves. Fuel heating is not included in the cost but may be obtained through Federal Housing. A day nursery is operated for children from two to ten years inclusive, thus enabling mothers to help in war work. There is a restaurant, a grocery and a meat market. Housing units are all within walking distance of your work. Applicants may apply to Willard here at the U. S. employment office or report to the engineering section, civilian personnel division, building T52, Ordnance depot, Ordinance.

Western front: Three breakthrough drives from Rhine bridgeheads since through German defenses; tanks take Main river bridge at Aachen; Bielefeld, 235 miles southwest of Berlin.  
Russian front: Two Russian army groups battle through western Hungary, nearing Austria; Germans report new offensive in Slovakia, heavy fighting east of Berlin.  
Italian front: Sharp patrol actions.  
Pacific front: Tokyo reports Americans attempting invasion of Okinawa group in Ryukyu island chain 325 miles south of Japanese homeland; U. S. bombers wrecked big Formosa hydro-electric plant.

### AGREEMENT REACHED BY LOGGING MEN

SPOKANE, March 26 (AP)—An agreement on piece work rates was reached by northwest logging operators meeting here Saturday. Walter D. Durham, wage stabilization director of the war labor board, announced. The operators were unable to formulate hourly rates. Their agreement, Durham said, will be considered by the west coast lumber commission which will make the final decision on wage scales. Some 70 representatives of the logging industry from eastern Washington, northern Idaho and western Montana attended.
