

ORDINANCES PROPOSED BY CITY COUNCIL

Attorney Henry Perkins draw up two proposed ordinances for the approval of the council next Monday night, to do with appointments to city vacancies, the other to a special election for the suburban area next June. The regular meeting will be held at the city hall.

The suggestion of Councilman Cantrill, the appointment ordinance will permit sections of the city charter to provide for filling of vacancies of councilman.

When the ordinance is approved, then it is suggested that the city follow the state law which already has been set up for filling vacancies of all elected officials. The state law sets forth that council appoint a member to office instead of going through a special election in which the vacancy occurs.

The law also applies to city elective officers. At the time the city charter has to do with appointment of all vacancies.

Cantrill urged preparation of ordinance to afford residents the south suburban area to be into the city. If they so desire, it is necessary to give weeks' publication notice of the ordinance. Cantrill said.

The councilman reviewed the ordinance, 1944, election when the south suburban area was not included to come into the city to misunderstand the filling of precincts and qualifications.

Cantrill said he was definitely opposed to annexation of any territory than the "triangle" previously designated, which includes Washburn way, Sta. way, and S. 8th.

Councilman Harvey Martin said they all want to be right in. If we're going to any government money for sewers, couldn't we use some of the money to fix the sewerage system?

Thomas A. Kenyon said the council as to how far aid has gone in the matter of sewers and said he had okay for the right to apply for federal works administration that the official application was being filled out at present time.

Cantrill motion made by Councilman Cantrill that recommendation of the recreation committee adopted in full to turn over to the Teen-age club, and the city add \$7 to complete contractor's bid, was seconded by Councilman Paul O. Landry and passed.

Kenyon apparently ends the Teen-age club discussion as far as the well is concerned.

E. Lamm of Lamm Lumber company, sought purchase of 11 in Fairview addition at a price of \$2283. An ordinance to this effect passed the council and second readings were brought from Modoc and will be placed on this program, it is understood.

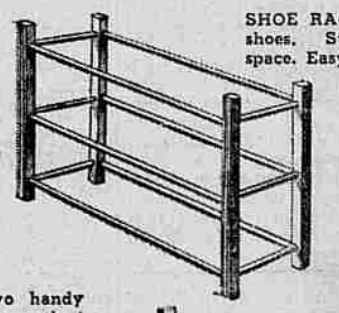
