

# STATE SUPREME COURT HEARS 2 ARGUMENTS

ALEM, March 28 (AP)—The supreme court heard arguments today in the first degree murder appeal of Andrew W. Davis, Portland, sentenced to the gallows for the slaying of his mother-in-law, Mrs. Anne Belle McNamara, 52, in her Portland apartment January 29, 1944.

The state charged that Dennis, leaving the mother-in-law responsible for the separation of Davis and his wife, strangled mother-in-law.

Dennis, who denied the slaying, charges lack of evidence, that he was convicted merely circumstantial evidence.

The court also heard arguments in the appeal of Carroll Cram, who was sentenced three years in prison from Multnomah county for the deaths of Wanda Henderson, 14, and brother, Allen, 18.

They were killed March 26, 1944, near McMinnville, when Cram's car overturned. The state charged that Cram was drunk when he was driving a pickup of youths home from a party.

Cram claims his constitutional rights were violated when officers took samples of his blood to determine whether he was drunk.

## HIMMLER ORDERS NEURNBERG QUIT

STOCKHOLM, March 28 (AP)—The free German press agency, whose sources of information are not announced, said today

that Henrich Himmler had ordered evacuation of Neurnberg and requisitioned vehicles to move party archives from Nazi congress halls there to Berchtesgaden.

The Stockholm Tidningen reported in an unattributed dispatch that organized demonstrations had broken out in Vienna and Steiermark province (Styria) against Nazi centers and

party functionaries, Russian agents who parachuted into those areas helped in plundering supplies and ammunition, it added.

Meanwhile officials of the Swedish aliens commission said Sweden was preparing for a heavy flow of German deserters, and Danish and Norwegian nazis.
