## PRICE CONTROL ACT EXTENDED ONE YEAR

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP) — Extension of the price control act for one year without change was approved today by the senate banking committee. . . The decision was reached after OPA officials assured the committee they would try by administrative means to adjust policy practices against which some business groups have complained. . . Chairman Wagner (D-N. Y.) told reporters he thought the committee action was now "all set" but that it could, of course, change its mind and recommend amendments before filing its report. . . The report probably will not be filed until next week. . . In approving an extension of the act without change, the committee not only turned down amendments asked by industry groups but a series of changes proposed by Price Administrator Chester Bowles. . . The OPA chief had recommended that he be empowered to place ceilings on movie tickets and barber and beauty shop charges. . . He also asked that rents for business establishments be brought under control. . . Still another Bowles proposal was for action to halt what he called the inflation of real estate and securities. . . On this latter proposal, the committee sentiment was described as being that any action taken should be handled as separate legislation rather than included in the price control law.

Among the straws in the wind, Churchill, in a campaign letter endorsing a candidate for membership in the house of commons, says: "The hour of success is NEAR." . . There are reports today that members of Churchill's cabinet have been ordered to remain close to their posts and that arrangements have been made to call parliament back into session if necessary during its 8-day Easter recess. . . A sharp INCREASE has been noted in the flow of government communications among the Big Three capitals.

KEEP your fingers crossed. But the time IS HERE when we are justified in paying some attention to these straws in the wind. . . THE Japs, who have been insisting for days that we have already LANDED on the Keramas (a small group of pin-point islands 15 miles west of Okinawa) assert today that 20 to 30 of our transports are trying to reinforce our troops there and that new fleets of our transports are moving into the central Ryukyus. . . Our Pacific command remains silent on landings, but Nimitz announces that Okinawa has been bombed for six days—by the heaviest guns of our fleets as well as planes. . . He admits that three of our ships have been seriously damaged and an unspecified number damaged less seriously by Jan air attacks. . . It's as near certain as anything can be that something big is shaping up in the Ryukyus behind all this screen-of silence.

THERE is a report today (unofficial and unconfirmed) that the Japs have rushed 300,000 Manchurian puppet troops into northern Manchuria to meet a POSSIBLE Russian invasion. . . Our B-29s go on pounding the Jap mainland and our General Arnold says today that superfort raids on Japan will be DOUBLED OR TRIPLED within the next three months. . . Contemplating what our planes have done to German production, that can't give the little yellow men much comfort. . . The longest river in the Netherlands East Indies is the Kapuas. . . The men, all of whom have pleaded guilty to one or more violations of the regulations, include the presidents and vice presidents of two pro-Japanese societies. . . ## PORTLAND STORES DRAW SUSPENSIONS

PORTLAND, Ore., March 28 (AP) — Four Fred Meyer stores have drawn 30-day suspensions as penalties for violating the OPA's Christmas day food ration order, Robert L. Sabin, attorney for the large grocery concern, said today. . . The ruling, which will prevent some of Portland's largest groceries from selling rationed processed foods and sugar from April 15-May 15, was issued by Robert M. Dulin, San Francisco, OPA hearing commissioner. . . Another Portland store, also charged with accepting invalid points on the day after Christmas, received only a warning after its hearing before another commissioner. . . The stores contended they were not officially notified of the order. Dulin ruled they should have attempted to comply after hearing of the change through newspaper and radio reports. . . Attorney Sabin said the grocery chain might carry an appeal to state or federal court.
