

Portland Mayor Has Praise For Klamath Shrine Effort

Klamath Falls Shrine club members, who are sponsoring a huge dance April 1 at the armory as a benefit for the Portland Shrine hospital for crippled children, continued today to receive warm commendation from state leaders in this work.

Mayor R. E. Riley of Portland, who is chairman of the board of the hospital, said:

"I want to express to you and the other splendid citizens of Klamath Falls area the deep and sincere appreciation of the entire board, the medical nursing staff, and particularly the children at the hospital for the very fine contributions Klamath county has made to the hospital."

He pointed out:

"This fifty-bed hospital administers to children only without concern for race, creed, or color, the principal prerequisite for admittance being that the parents of the children are unable to pay for treatment. During the past 20 years of its existence it has received approximately five thousand little tots whose outlook upon life was hopeless and forlorn. These twisted little bodies have been corrected or cured of their deformities, and the children have taken their rightful place in society and become useful citizens in the various communities to which they returned. We have had many from the Klamath Falls area, several of whom now are serving in the armed forces of the United States."

ROSEBURG, March 29 (AP)—Alva C. Marsters, retired Roseburg banker and chairman of the state fair board for 15 years, died at his home here last night after a long illness.

Marsters, 85, was the first mayor of incorporated Roseburg, and represented Douglas county in the state senate from 1900 to 1904. He founded the Roseburg National bank in 1907, continuing as its president until the bank's sale in 1937.

BALLOT TITLES FOR TAX MEASURES DONE

SALEM, March 29 (AP)—Ballot titles for the two tax measures referred by the legislature and to be voted upon at a special election June 22 were completed today by Attorney General George Neuner.

They are:

(1) Propose a five-mill tax for a two-year period to raise \$10,000,000 for construction and repair of buildings at state institutions and for new construction at state institutions of higher learning, the tax to be offset by surplus state income tax receipts.

(2) Provide a two-cent tax on each package of cigarettes sold in Oregon, the revenue going to the support of public schools, raising an estimated \$2,000,000 annually.

The legislature provided that no other measures shall be on the same ballot.

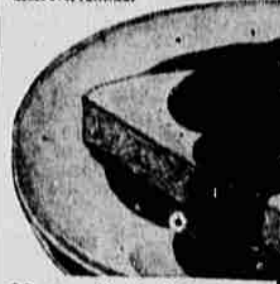
