

California Assembly Passes Legislation on Insurance Law

SAFETY, March 29 (AP)—The California legislature today passed legislation to revamp California unemployment insurance law before the state senate after clearing major amendments in the assembly and the social security committee.

DECLARES POINT VALUES CHANGED AGAIN

WASHINGTON, March 29 (AP)—The War Relocation Authority today announced that it has changed the point values for various commodities. The point values for sweet cherries, prunes and tomato juice are slashed.

The blue point program, announced by OPA to begin to pay more for pork and pork products, shortening, margarine and cooking oils. The point increases range from three points a pound, to five points a pound, to ten points a pound, to twenty points a pound, to thirty points a pound, to forty points a pound, to fifty points a pound, to sixty points a pound, to seventy points a pound, to eighty points a pound, to ninety points a pound, to one hundred points a pound.

They were given a new value of 20 points a pound, and 30 points a pound. Both items being valued 10 points below their original value. The point values have been moving rapidly, OPA said.

Point values for three fruit products, tomato juice, on the other hand, has been behind schedule. This makes it possible, the agency explained, to cut values of 24 cans of sweet cherries, down 20, and plums, down 20 points, down 10, 30 per cent cut in tomato values reduces No. 2 cans points, while 46-ounce cans go to 20 points.

disclosing revision of red values last night, Price Administrator Chester Bowles said increases are necessary because the supply will be about 10 per cent less in April than in March.

He said, however, that the 10 per cent cut in overall civilian supplies for the next months "will be felt very during April."

May and June, he added, normally is a sharper decline in meat production. The increase will be felt to a great extent.

Examples of the revision of point values are an advance from 10 to 12 points a pound for ham slices from 10 to 12, roasts from 7 to 8, bacon 6 to 8. Sausages go up a

went to the senate after passage by the lower house, 72 to 1.

The senate social security committee put its okay on bills to extend fund credits of service men to October 1, 1947, and to establish an investigation division to stamp out benefit "chiseling."

Some definite action toward settlement of the subsidies issue, which has stalemated the assembly, was in prospect from the senate side. The upper house's governmental efficiency committee scheduled a hearing for today on the League of California Cities-County Supervisors association measure for \$100,000,000 of state subventions to the local governments for post-war projects and improvements.

A smaller allocation, \$57,000,000, attached as a rider to the administration tax reduction bill has been hung up in the assembly and some members were looking toward the senate for some action which might break the jam.

Meanwhile, administration supporters of the tax bill, unable to strip the rider from it, delayed calling it up for further consideration and amendments. The administration's tax program—continuation of the \$100,000,000 reductions of 1943—is contained in four other bills in the senate which could be taken up if the fourth assembly bill were to be abandoned.

GRIFFIN ISSUES CURFEW STATEMENT

R. M. Griffin, commandant of the 13th naval district issues the following statement regarding the curfew on places of amusement:

"All personnel of the navy, marine corps and coast guard are hereby directed to observe the curfew by leaving places of entertainment of whatever kind prior to midnight. Shore patrols shall be instructed to assist in the observance of the curfew."

"District commandants in the continental United States will cause this order to be promulgated to all activities located in their several districts, including ships and units of the United States fleet, now or hereafter in port."

The Western Front: First army plunged within 207 miles of Berlin; third in close contact, 214 miles from capital; British and Americans in the north exploited swift breakthrough toward Muenster; seventh army reached the Main, cleared northern part of Mannheim.

The Russian Front: Red army troops cracked defenses before Bratislava gap, reached Austrian border; in places 38 miles from Vienna; forces in north occupied Gdynia, fought into western part of Danzig; armies mass-

ed on central front for Berlin drive. The Italian Front: Germans repulsed in counterattack on British positions north of Faenza; front otherwise quiet. Fry sausage in hot frying pan; pour off half the fat; add bread cubes; fry with sausage until well browned; add eggs and milk beaten together. Cook slowly, stirring with a fork until eggs are firm but still soft. Serves 4 to 6.

Note: Finely diced bacon or ham may be substituted for the sausage.
