## Special Election To Cost \$75,000

SALEM, March 30 (AP)—The special election on June 22 will cost \$75,000, of which the counties will pay \$50,000 and the state \$25,000. David O'Hara, head of the state elections division, said today.

There will be two measures on the ballot. One would enact a 2-cent cigarette tax to raise \$2,000,000 a year for schools, and the other would levy a property tax of 5 mills for two years to raise \$10,000,000 for new buildings for state institu-

tions of higher learning and for state hospitals.

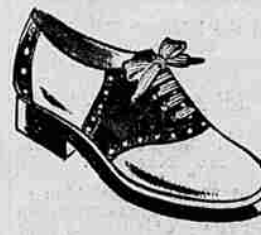
