Lack of Grazing Blamed For Shortage

PORTLAND, April 5 (AP)—Refusal of federal officials to allow small ranchers to run cattle on public grazing land was blamed by a central Oregon cattleman today for the meat shortage.

Willard D. McDaniel, Grandview, exhibited a letter from a forest supervisor saying that "the urgency for increased production of beef no longer exists" and that grazing permits no longer can be justified.

Speakers on the question pointed out that if OPA is needed for more than one year, a further extension can be voted at that time.

SCHOOLS LOW IN COST, EFFICIENT

Oregon taxpayers receive more for every dollar spent for education than taxpayers of any other state of the union, according to the results of a study just published by the National Education Association.

According to this study, Oregon spends \$65 per child and ranks 25th from the top of the list for the per school capita cost of education while, according to the registrants examined by selective service, Oregon shows three-tenths of one per cent or the lowest per cent of mental and educational deficiencies.

Alabama ranks 44th in the list per pupil cost and ranks highest with 13 per cent mental and educational deficiencies, according to the selective service figures. California spends an average of \$88 with 2.8 per cent deficiencies and Washington spends \$81 with 1.2 per cent deficiencies.

Oregon school children complete an average of nine and seven-tenths years of school at the current average cost of \$65 per child, while children from

Nevada complete an average of ten and one-tenth years per child at a cost of \$102 per child per year.

The National Education Association study reveals further that Oregon ranks third in the circulation of national magazines and ranks sixth in per capita sales, indicating that there is a high correlation between literacy and commerce.
